### CHAPTER-3

#### SITTINGS TAKEN BY HON'BLE CHAIRPERSON/ VICE-CHAIRPERSON/ MEMBERS ON THE IMPORTANT CASES WITH FOCUS OF RESOLVED CASES.

Under Article 338A (5) (b) of the Constitution, Commission has been assigned duty "to inquire into specific complaint with respect to the deprivation of rights and safeguards of the Scheduled Tribes"

2 The Commission receives representations from individual members of Scheduled Tribes, or their associations, etc. These representations/ petitions pertain to:

- (i) The violation of the instructions for reservation in services/ posts,
- (ii) Problems relating to the socio-economic development of Scheduled Tribes such as admission in educational institutions, land alienation, rehabilitation and displacement as a result of setting up of projects etc., and
- (iii) Atrocities on members of Scheduled Tribes by non-Scheduled Tribe persons.

These representations are referred to the concerned organizations of the Central Govt. or the State Govts. by the Commission, requesting them to furnish full facts within a given timeframe. The facts furnished by the concerned organization are examined by the Commission; and in case, on examination, the Commission finds that there has been violation of the safeguards of the members of Scheduled Tribes, provided under the Constitution or under any other law or order of the Government, it advises the concerned organization to take corrective measures within a given timeframe and apprise the Commission of the action taken.

A copy of the reply sent by the concerned organization is forwarded to the petitioner for his/her information and in case the petitioner submits a rejoinder containing additional material, the same is further examined in consultation with the concerned organization. If the Commission does not get a reply from the concerned organization on the points raised in the petition/ rejoinder despite repeated reminders, the Commission holds a sitting in the case and invites the Head of the organization and/ or any other senior officer of that organization to appear before the Commission for discussion. The petitioner is also permitted to be present during the hearing. The recommendation made after the discussions are recorded and sent to the respective organization for taking necessary action on the Commission's advice/recommendation within a specified period of time. The Commission held 66 sittings during the year 2016-17.

While dealing in the specific complaints, Commission noted the matter or a complaint which could have been resolved within by the Departments authorities and thereby Scheduled Tribes persons would not have been victimised/ harassed for their legitimate rights/ safeguards. Commission has further noted that specific complaints take from several months to year because



concerned officials try to ignore such complaints and also the communication from the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes, possibly due to lack of knowledge and lack of humanitarian attitude towards the needs and problems of poor and shying Scheduled Tribes persons for their legitimate rights and enshrined by the Constitution.

6. The Commission therefore, recommends that the concerned Departments/ Ministries/ Organizations in Centre and State should take effective steps to ensure that each Government official is made aware of the safeguards provided for Scheduled Tribes for which training should be imparted to the dealing officers/ officials in the beginning of service about their duties and responsibilities prescribed in the rules relating to the subject matter to be assigned to him/her to ensure availability of safeguards to the Scheduled Tribes employees/ beneficiaries under various development schemes and particularly to the victims of atrocity under the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes POA Act, 1989.

3.1 PROCEEDINGS OF THE SITTING TAKEN BY SHRI RAVI THAKUR, HON'BLE VICE CHAIRPERSON, IN THE APPLICATION FILED BY SHRI HARI SHANKAR MEENA, KARAUJI, RAJASTHAN FOR EXTENSION OF JOINING TIME TO ASSUME THE POST OF INSPECTOR IN CENTRAL EXCISE, COIMBATORE.

3.1.1 The case in brief in respect of the application filed by Shri Hari Shankar Meena, resident of Karauji, Rajasthan was briefly explained to the Hon'ble Vice-Chairperson. The case in brief was that Shri Hari Shankar Meena - Roll No. 240503546 and Rank No. SLD/3957 was nominated for appointment to the post of inspect in the Central Excise in Central Excise Zone, Chennai in the PB-2 scale of Rs. 9300-34800 plus Grade Pay of Rs. 4600/- through the Combined Graduate Level Examination for 2012 conducted by Staff Selection Commission vide Board's letter dated 16.09.2013. He was issued offer of appointment vide letter dated 4.12.2013 of Chief Commissioner of Central Excise, Chennai. He was supposed to join by 31.12.2013 in the normal joining time.

3.1.2 Shri Hari Shankar Meena requested for extension of joining time on the grounds of family exigencies in two separate spells of 3 months each. He was given an extension to join duty till 03.06.2014 from the date of issue of offer of appointment and not from the date of initial expiry of joining time which was 31.12.2013, citing his mother's illness vide letter dated 21.03.2014, in accordance with O.M. dated 06.06.78 and 09.06.95 of Department of Personnel & Training. He has made all out efforts to join within this time and has booked air tickets twice. But he could not proceed to Coimbatore as his mother fell seriously ill and he had to cancel the tickets. Hence, he has again requested for extension of another 12 days time till 15.06.2014 to join the post by a fax sent on 01.06.2014 citing his mother's illness. This date is before expiry of the extended date of joining which was 03.06.2014.

3.1.3 Since the period of extension requested by Shri Hari Shankar Meena was beyond six months of extended period (which includes the normal one month joining time), the office of Chief Commissioner of Central Excise, Chennai Zone, Chennai forwarded the request to Staff Selection Commission, Chennai Regional Office.
